- 1. To one's fingers crossed (Hope for the best, that nothing will happen to upset one's plan) - अच्छी चीज की आशा करना। We kept our fingers crossed till the final results were declared.
- 2. Blue blood (an aristocrat) उच्च क्लीन व्यक्ति। His habits reveal that blue blood is still flowing in his veins.
- 3. A snake in the grass (an unrecognisable enemy) आस्तीन का सांप Manohar proved to be a snake in the grass
- 4. To look blue (sad or discontented) उदास, असंतुष्ट। Mohan looked blue as he had failed.
- 5. To look blank (to look puzzled) परेशान दिखना। Why are you looking blank these days?
- 6. At daggers drawn (In open enmity) कटु शत्रुता होना। India and Pakistan are at daggers drawn these days.
- 7. At sixes and sevens (in disorder) अस्त-व्यस्त। The books were lying at sixes and sevens in the room.
- 8. Apple of discord (cause of quarrel) झगडे की जड। Kashmir is the apple of discord between India and Pakistan.
- 9. Bone of contention (cause of quarrel) झगडे का कारण। Kashmir is the bone of contention between India and Pakistan.
- 10.At one's beck and call (at one's service) सेवा में तत्पर। He is always at the beck and call of his father.
- 11.At a loss (be perplexed, uncertain) अनिश्चयी होना) He was at a loss for words. I am at a loss and don't know what to do.
